# Discover Sailing on a Keelboat

Keelboats allow you to learn to sail without fear of capsizing and with several other people on the boat. Learning to sail in keelboats provides a learning platform that is stable yet responsive. As your skills progress, you will also develop an understanding of each person's role and how teamwork plays a major part of being an effective crew.

## Where & When Can I Learn to Sail a Keelboat?

Three Clubs situated on the picturesque Swan River and located within easy reach by car from Perth's CBD and Fremantle. Courses are run throughout the year with various timings at each Club - there is something to suit even the busiest schedule.

## Do I need my own boat?

No, boats are provided by the Clubs or Swan River Sailing for use during the program.

## Do I need to be a member of a Club to participate?

You do not need to be a yacht club member to take part in a sailing program or experience at a recognised Australian Sailing Discover Sailing Centre.

## What happens after I complete a learn to sail course?

Keelboats of all sizes require a crew to sail. Club members who own boats are always looking for crew. You don't need to commit to crewing on an ongoing basis so it's a great way to get out on the water and find out more about the sport. Clubs are able to put potential crew in contact with boat owners looking for crew.

## What do I need to bring?
